Our Mission Statement:

Many of you have included notations on your renewal forms dealing with the sad condition of many of our streets and intersections in the Woodlands. We contacted the Department of Public Works and this is what we've learned:

Funds for street rehabilitation generally come from Gas Tax Funds which are generated per gallon of gas sold and distributed based on population. Recently, the state reduced our City's Gas Tax Fund allotment by approximately 15%. Further reduction will most likely occur due to the increase in the number of hybrid/electric vehicles, as well as higher fuel-efficiency vehicles. Additionally, federal and state grants are available for arterial streets; very few grants can be used on residential streets.

Pavement rehab on residential streets west of Cañada Boulevard is not included in the City's 3-year Capital Improvement Plan. Considering improvements recently completed on Cañada and the streets east of Cañada, it is unlikely the city will return to our area in the near future. There are many streets in the same or worse condition and funds need to be spread evenly throughout the City and the potential of changing to city council districts could further complicate the future rehabilitation timeline. (*Not my words*)!

Hope you find this informative, albeit disappointing.

The San Gabriel Valley Habitat for Humanity is working on its 9th Build in Glendale project. Its building of affordable homes is supported by its retail store for lightly used and new household goods and construction materials. **Restore** often has antiques as well as new items and the stock is always changing.

Donations are most welcome...and it's a great way to de-clutter your home! And, if you donate excess building materials, you will receive a receipt for income tax purposes.






